Play steady beats and simple rhythms following a simple graphic score based on The Little Red Hen.


Parents as Partners

Share stories about farms together, e.g. Old MacDonald, Noisy Farm and Farmer Duck.


At the shops, talk about the foods you buy and where they come from. Name some fruits and vegetables.

Discuss with your child how grown up they are. Chat with them about moving on to Reception in September and all the exciting learning they will do in their new class!


