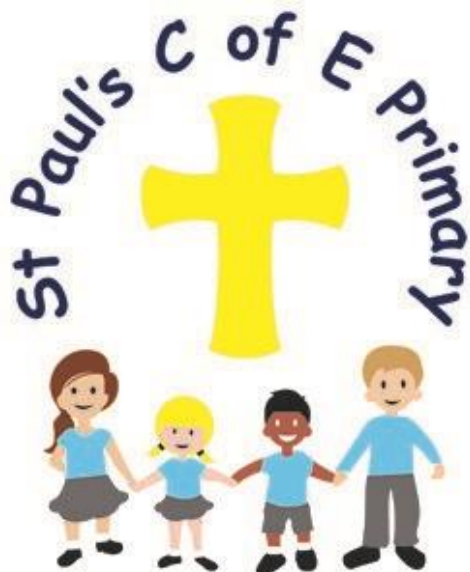

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	70%	<i>Our data reflects the context of our school, as the majority of our children do not access swimming lessons outside of school due to cost and distance. School can also only begin lessons in Year 4, which means that for some children, at this point they are complete non-swimmers. We also have a very high percentage of SEND, which can impact on their ability to learn to swim and water confidence.</i>
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	74%	<i>As above</i>

<p>What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?</p>	<p>81%</p>	<p><i>As above</i></p>
