## Activities

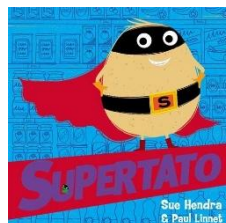
Writing, with independence, character descriptions and captions based on our 'key text' Writing simple versions of the story 'Supertato.'

Learning that not all Superheroes wear capes and identifying 'heroes' who help us in our communities.

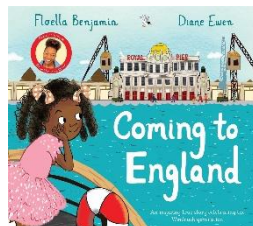
Discussing the meaning of 'achievement' and finding out about people in our present and in the past who have achieved great things.
