In the true spirit of the King's Coronation, and doing things for the community, we spent the week leading up to the event baking cakes.

We then delivered the cakes to the local care homes for them to enjoy as part of their celebrations.

The children fully engaged, and understood why they were baking, and it was a lovely opportunity to visit the care homes and give a little something to make others smile.



Road Safety Projects

Our Year 2, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 classes were invited to take part in Road Safety sessions run by Stockport Council's Road Safety Team.

Year 2 - Step Outside - the children learnt how to cross a road safely and to remember to always look both ways and listen out for moving vehicles. The Road Safety team were impressed with the childrens' knowledge and sensible attitude towards keeping safe when outside.



Year 4 - Headsmart - through a practical experiment using an egg and bubblewrap, the children worked together in small groups. They decorated the egg and gave it a name, which was then wrapped in bubblewrap and placed in a bag. The groups tested the protection of the eggs by being dropped.

Year 5 - The Crashed Vehicle - the children looked at why road collisions occur and what safety features cars can have. The children built a car from a template which was crash tested on a ramp to see how well they built their car.

Year 6 - Child Speedwatch - the children learnt about measuring speed and stopping distances. As part of the session the children were taken out of school to record vehicle speeds using a speed gun.



Reception Trip

Reception visited Sugar Brook Farm and had a wonderful time feeding the animals. Farmer John talked to the children about where their food comes from and how they look after the animals. We had a picnic lunch in the barn and in the afternoon went on a minibeast hunt!
